1. Turabian and “Local Guidelines”

Citing an Electronic Reader (e.g. Kindle)

- While Turabian does not specifically make provision for citing electronic reader editions, refer to “A Basic Guide to Footnotes and Bibliography” if you are using editions produced for an electronic reader.
- If the electronic edition does not include standard pagination, you must include the specific, static location of the quotation cited.

Citations (p. 136: 15.3.1; Chapter 16): Use bibliography style citations with footnotes.

- When using resources produced for an electronic reader, refer to “A Basic Guide to Footnotes and Bibliography” for how to cite the edition properly, both as a footnote and bibliographic entry. If the electronic edition does not include standard pagination, you must include the specific, static location of the quotation cited.
