We seek to reflect the wealth of denominations, ethnicities, cultures, and traditions present at Fuller out of the conviction that to do so is to more fully live into our calling to be the Body of Christ in the world. By making use of a variety of worship patterns, musical styles, drama, and visual art, we seek to engage all our senses as we worship the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
