

Neuropsychology Track Requirements

DESCRIPTION

The Neuropsychology Track emphasizes coursework, clinical training, and research experiences in the area of neuropsychology.

DOCUMENTATION

Progress through the track can be stated on the student's CV. Successful completion of the track will be reflected on the graduate's transcript.

ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA

Admittance is contingent on the student's level of commitment to research, course work, and clinical goals consistent with completing this track and pursuing a career in neuropsychology.

CLINICAL TRAINING

- Attend one year of monthly neuropsychology seminars
- A year-long neuropsychological assessment clerkship at a local training site
- An advanced practicum placement in a neuropsychology setting that provides some combination of general clinical training and assessment, or a formal non-practicum placement in a neuropsychology setting, and
- A year-long internship focused on neuropsychology

CLASSROOM WORK

Students will take courses in areas such as:

- Neuropsychology
- Psychopharmacology
- Physiological Psychology

MEMBERSHIPS

Students are expected to become members of at least one of the following associations:

- The international Neuropsychology Society
- APA Division 40
- American Academy of Clinical Neuropsychology, and/or
- National Academy of Neuropsychology

DISSERTATION AND PRESENTATIONS

- The content of the dissertation focuses on neuropsychology.
- Students present a neuropsychology-related research project at a professional neuropsychology conference (such as AACN, INS, NAN, or APA Division 40).
