









### Nana's German Potato Salad

A vinegar-based salad consisting of potatoes, onions, & bacon

### **Ingredients**

- Potatoes sliced not too thick & cooked
- 1 lb cooked bacon (chopped), save grease
- 1 onion (white or yellow)
- ¾ cup vinegar
- ½ cup sugar
- Salt & pepper
- 1 ½ tsp flour

#### **Directions**

Stir into grease sugar, vinegar, and flour.
Bring this sauce to a boil. Remove from heat.

Mix potatoes, onions, bacon and pour in sauce. Mix thoroughly and enjoy!

### Okra and Sun

Okra and Sun is a popular West African dish.

### Ingredients

- Fufu flower (Masa brand)
- Water

### Okra Soup

- Package Fresh Okra (cut into little pieces)
- A pack of uncooked shrimp
- Peanut butter
- Salt
- 2 onions (cut into little pieces)
- Pepper (if you want it to be spicy hot)
- "Better Than Bouillon"
- Olive oil (or an oil of your choice)
- And any extra cooking herbs you like.

### **Directions**

Boil water in a pot, mix a small cup of fufu flour in cold water into a small bowl, add it in the boiling pot and stir (turn down the flames to medium, leave it to cook for 5 minutes) then add more fufu flour, and keep mixing it until it is firm like mash potatoes. Let it cook for 8 minutes on low flames (make sure to close the lid). Then turn it off. It is ready.

Steam your shrimp with half of the amount of diced onions and a pinch of salt for 5 minutes. Remove the shrimp from the first pot and put it into the second pot (empty pot). Add olive oil, remaining chopped onions, salt, pepper and bouillon (season to taste). Cook for 3 minutes. Add the fresh okra, a large spoonful of peanut butter, and 3 cups of water. Stir for several minutes until blended. Cook for 25 minutes. Ready to eat!

## **Chicken Adobo**

Philippines' unofficial national dish: chicken braised in garlic, vinegar, soy sauce, peppercorns, and bay leaves.

### **Ingredients**

- 1 cup white vinegar
- ¼ cup soy sauce
- 8 cloves garlic, minced; reserve a Tb
- ½ Tb salt
- 2 tsp ground black pepper

- 4 bay leaves
- 1 kilo or 2 pounds bone-in chicken cuts
- 1 Tb cooking oil
- 1 cup water
- 1 chili pepper, chopped (optional)
- 1 lemon wedge (optional)

#### **Directions**

- 1. Place chicken in a large bowl; add salt, pepper, garlic, vinegar, soy sauce, and 2 bay leaves. Cover bowl and refrigerate to let chicken marinate for 20-30 minutes.
- 2. In a casserole, heat tablespoon of oil over medium heat; add reserved garlic and fry until golden brown and crispy. Scoop out fried garlic and set aside.
- 3. Place chicken cuts in casserole; pour in marinade, add water and remaining bay leaves. Bring to a boil and reduce heat to low fire. Cover casserole and allow to cook for 25 to 30 minutes. Stir chicken every 10 minutes.
- 4. Once adobo sauce has reduced, add in chili pepper and stir. Allow to boil for 5 more minutes, then turn off heat and then squeeze lemon into the adobo mix.
- 5. Serve in a dish and top the adobo with fried garlic.


The background is a mixture of watercolor and gouache. Lettering is done in 24 karat gold and Turner's Acryl Gouache.

# **Ekklesia Contemporary Ballet's Dark Night and Theological discussion**


