St Paul as the primordial theologian of global-gratitude-expansion!

- ... giving thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ (Ephesians 5.20)
- Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God (**Philippians 4.6**)
- And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him (Colossians 3.17)
- ...give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you
 (1 Thessalonians 5.18)

Global-gratitude-expansion: eschatological-apocalyptic dimensions

- ... And whenever the living creatures give glory and honour and thanks to the one who is seated on the throne, who lives for ever and ever ... (Revelation 4.9)
- ... singing, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen' (Revelation 7.12)
- ... singing,
 'We give you thanks, Lord God Almighty,
 who are and who were,
 for you have taken your great power
 and begun to reign... (Revelation 11.17)

Toward global-gratitude-expansion: apostolic gratitude

- ... giving thanks in light of the end: "The believers* from there, when they heard of us, came as far as the Forum of Appius and Three Taverns to meet us. On seeing them, Paul thanked God and took courage" (Acts of the Apostles 28.15)
- ... while in the middle: "After he had said this, he took bread; and giving thanks to God in the presence of all, he broke it and began to eat" (Acts of the Apostles 27.35)
